## A Note From Fr. Danny

Last time we looked at the four core principles of Catholic social teaching (CST). We looked at human dignity and the common good, and now let's consider the last two, solidarity and subsidiarity.

Solidarity is a recognition that we are responsible for each other, a commitment to the good of all and of each individual. We are one human family despite our differences. A major theme here is the preferential option for the poor and vulnerable. A moral test for society is how we treat the most vulnerable among us: the unborn, the poor, the immigrant, those dealing with disabilities or terminal illness.

Subsidiarity is the principle that larger institutions in society should not overwhelm or interfere with smaller or local institutions, including families. However, larger institutions have essential responsibilities when smaller institutions cannot adequately protect human dignity, meet human needs, or advance the common good. Supporting families should be a priority for economic and social policies.

Every citizen has a right and a duty to participate in shaping society to promote the well-being of individuals and the common good. To do so, we must develop the virtue of prudence in applying the principles of CST to the issues at stake when we vote. The Virginia Catholic Conference, the public policy advocacy group representing our bishops in the Commonwealth, every year compiles election resources at [vacatholic.org](http://vacatholic.org). They also maintain an email network that sends out alerts on legislative issues during the General Assembly sessions.

It's important to avoid two temptations in exercising faithful citizenship: treating all issues as morally equivalent, or reducing everything to one or two issues. CST anchors our commitment to defend human life and other human rights in the fundamental obligation to respect the dignity of every human being as a child of God.

# **Saint Ann Building Projects: Kitchen and Food Pantry Expansion**

## **Frequently Asked Questions – UPDATED**

### **Q. What is the history of the *Living Our Mission* campaign here?**

A. *Living Our Mission* was a diocesan-wide capital and endowment campaign. In 2015, Saint Ann undertook its share of the campaign; our goal was \$1,000,000, and we raised \$1,128,125 in pledges. Saint Ann has been receiving back 55% for donations and pledge payments up to our goal and will receive 90% back for anything collected over the goal. As of September 30, 2019, we have received back \$325,099.33 and we have spent \$174,936.37 on projects and planning so far.

We have replaced the windows in the worship space and chapel, and we have paid off the rectory mortgage. We are still in the planning phase for revitalization of the baptismal font.

### **Q. Why are we not renovating the current kitchen in its existing space? What will the new kitchen look like?**

A. After investigation and consultation with various parish ministries and groups, it was decided that an expansion/addition would be a better option. The current kitchen has had recurring plumbing issues (hence why the sinks are not being used right now), as the plumbing in the space was never meant to sustain a kitchen (the space was used as the sacristy and sanctuary in the previous church). After the new kitchen is completed, the old kitchen space will be used for storage.

The new kitchen will be 1,026 square feet, 28.5' x 36', on the parking lot side of Condon Hall. This project will provide a state-of-the-art, fire code compliant, commercial kitchen and new equipment. There will be a serving line area accessed from the existing hall through two arched openings. This also includes a patio for outdoor cooking events and a brick screen wall.

### **Q. Why are we expanding on the parking lot side of Condon Hall (south) and not the north?**

A. After investigation, the ground on the north side of Condon Hall was found not to be conducive for construction. We have already transplanted the crape myrtle tree and the other shrubs in direct line of the contraction.

**Q. What will the food pantry addition look like?**

A. The food pantry addition will be 576 square feet, 24' x 24', which essentially doubles the size of the existing space, and includes a new electrical service and heating and cooling system for the addition and the existing building, plus sidewalks and canopies.

**Q. Why has it taken so long for us to get to this point?**

A. After the active campaign phase, it was decided to bundle together three projects: the kitchen addition, the food pantry addition, and replacing the roof over Condon Hall. As we worked with parish leadership, pastoral and finance councils, committees, and funding over the past three years, we also worked through a formal approval process through the diocese. The projects were bundled together for efficiencies of design and construction, which will ultimately save us time and money. After the projects were approved by the diocese in late 2018, we unfortunately ran into issues with our general contractor, who could not produce an agreeable contract. After switching contractors, we now believe we have a workable contract.

**Q. When will construction begin, how long will it last, and what will we do for activities when Condon Hall and the food pantry are unavailable?**

A. Once the contract is signed, our contractors can acquire the necessary permits. Once that is done, construction can begin. The length of construction is estimated to be about 9 months. We are exploring options for what to do when Condon Hall and the food pantry are unavailable, such as using the school building.

**Q. How much will this cost, and how are we funding it?**

A. The total cost for the three projects will be about \$641,000. It will be funded largely through returns from the *Living Our Mission* Campaign, as well as a construction loan through the diocese. Thus, we do ask you to continue your pledge payments.

**Q. I am a new parishioner and I would like to contribute to the campaign, or I was not able to pledge during the active phase in 2015. Can I pledge now?**

A. Absolutely! There are pledge cards and envelopes in the commons, as well as in the parish office. You may still make a pledge over five years if you so desire. Please do not mail completed pledge cards to the diocese; please instead deliver them to the parish office for processing.


